R.L. died Thursday January 26th following a short stay at a local care center. He was born on March 13, 1920, in Watervliet, Mich. He was the second born and oldest son of Roy Laverre and Gladys Pauline (0 Muth) Harris. moved several times fa in Michigan, but moved from Detroit to Oak Grove, Ore., in June of 1930. From there they moved to Vernonia in 1932, Silverton in finally 1934, to and Prineville in 1938-39. R.L. moved with his father to a barren piece of property in Prineville in the fall of 1938, after he finished high school. They built a house and broke out sagebrush for crops and the remainder of the family moved the following summer. He found himself building B-17 bombers in Seattle when WWII broke out. He re-turned home to join the service, but was given a medical deferment due to hearing problems. Instead, he stayed on the farm, working for his parents (two other brothers served in the Pacific).

In 1945 he met a new OSC Ext. Agent, Lulu Earnart, who visited the farm view his brother Dougley 4-H project. They were married at the First Methodist Church in Pendleton on Feb. 24,1946. They moved and began a farming partnership with Lulu's father, R.O.O. Earnheart, on the family farm north of Pendleton in

March of 1950. "Ott" died in 1954 and they ultimately took over full ownership from the heirs.

They were very active in the Methodist Church and the Cold Spring Grange. In

addition to farming, R.L. sold grange property and auto insurance for over 20 years. He enjoyed hunting, mostly big game, and fishing.

R.L. was very active in the farm community and

was named Outstanding Young Farmer by the Pend. Jr. Chamber in 1956. In the spring of 1959 the family was selected for a documentary of Oregon farm families filmed by Oregon State College Ext. He served on the PGG Board and as an officer of the Umatilla Co. Wheat Growers.

In 1963, the Ford Motor Co. named him the Ford Farm Almanac Farm Efficiency Award winner for wheat growers and the Pendleton FFA named him an Honorary Chapter Farmer.


The OSU College of Ag. Sciences named him to the Diamond Pioneer Ag. Career Achievement Registry in 2009.

glas.


