

# Betty Booth Stewart

Beaverton

November 11, 1919-October 29, 2012

Betty Stewart died peacefully at her home in Beaverton on October 29 at the age of 92. She was born in Meacham and attended Meacham Grade School and Pendleton High School (1936) and Eastern Oregon College (1938 ad 1962). Her first teaching jobs were in the one-room school house on Cabbage Hill and the Meacham Grade School. She authored a memoir, "The Long Brown Stocking," and a history, "Meacham: A Wide Spot on the Oregon Trail," both portraying the life of this small town in the Blue Mountains.

Betty and her husband, James Allen Stewart (died 1998), lived in Pendleton from 1950-1971. They moved to Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, and then to Tigard, Oregon. She is survived by her three

daughters, Mary McCormick, Carol Stewart-Smith and Sue Ellen Stewart Jones, two sons, Mart Stewart and David Stewart, and nine grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.

Internment will be November 9 at 1:30 p.m. at the Olney Cemetery in Pendle-

ton, Oregon. A Celebration of Life service will be held Saturday, November 10 at 2 p.m. at Calvin Presbyterian Church, Tigard, Oregon. All are welcome.
