Barbara Kononen Hernandez, 86, died in Eugene, Oregon, on January 5, 2013. During her 21-year tenure, she was named Teacher of the Month numerous times, and awarded Teacher of the Year in 1981. Many of Barbara's students became lifelong friends.

Post-retirement, she cared for her garden, read many books, followed politics, and was a great fan of the Boise State and UO football teams. She also kept in contact with and enjoyed visits from many of her former students, and she will be missed by her best friend Ileana Oakes of Ironside, Ore.

In 2005, Barbara moved to Eugene, Ore., to be near her three nieces, Tammy (Plant) Lutz, Pamela Plant, and Kim Plant, all of Eugene, as well as her honorary nephew, Mike Lutz, each of whom were caregivers for "Auntie B." Barbara's additional surviving nieces and nephews are Elaine Kononen Cutting (Rod), Arni Kononen (Lynne), Robert Kononen, Adrythe ("Rusty") Kononen Bramer, Clifford "Kip" Kononen, Michael Kononen and Kristine Kononen. Barbara will be remembered by her family and close friends for her loyalty, wit and sense of humor, and by all as a great lady.
