PENDLETON — Irvin R. Planting, 92, of Pendleton died Saturday, June 5, 2010, at Patricia Cant's Adult Foster Care. Planting

Mr. Planting was born April 6, 1918, in Pendleton to William and Mary (Ring) Planting. He attended school in Helix and Pendleton, and graduated from Pendleton High School in 1936. After graduation he attend business school in Boise, Idaho.

He served in the Army from 1941 to 1943, and was a World War II veteran, attaining the rank of master sergeant. He served in the southern Philippines, where he earned a Philippine Liberation Medal with one Bronze Service Star.

After the service he re-

turned to Pendleton, where he worked as an accountant, payroll clerk and credit manager at Pendleton Canning Co., Pioneer

Implement, Pendleton Grain Growers and Comrie Olds-Cadillac. He also served as a payroll clerk at a gold mine in Idaho.

Survivors include nephews Dave and Bill Umbarger, both of Pendleton, and

Arlen and Greg Planting of Boise, Idaho; nieces Marilyn Thorne of Pendleton and Sherrill Durham of Boise; and many great- and great-great-nieces and nephews.

He was preceded in death by his parents; brothers Clarence, Earl and John Planting; and sister Bernice Umbarger.
