Elma was born December 5, 1927 to Russell and Alvina Reiber Campbell in Huntington, Oregon. Later the family moved to Pendleton. She graduated from Pendleton High School and Saint Anthony's School of Nursing.

Along with helping on the farm and raising four children, she was involved with multiple clubs and organizations.
