

Joel A. Woodruff – longtime Pendleton resident died Sunday, November 9, 2014, at his home. He was 88 years old. Joel Woodruff was born September 20, 1926 in Tremonton, Utah, to V.J. and Millie Rosetta Woodruff. He was raised in Tremonton where he attended Seventh-day Adventist Church School through 10th grade, as well as Welding Classes at Bear River High School. His family had an airplane on the family farm. Joel belonged to the Flying Farmers of America Club. He had a private pilot's license and could fly crosscountry and take passengers. He narrowly missed military service; WWII was almost over by the time he turned 18. On November 24, 1947 he married Wilma Lee Randall in Elko, NV. They moved to: Dallas, Oregon, in 1950; then Lakeside, Oregon, in 1953; to Odgen, Utah, in 1956; on to Boise, Idaho, in 1960; establishing residency in Umatilla County, Oregon in 1975. Wilma preceded him in death in 1977. On February 24, 1978, Joel married Joyce Marie Hobdy in Gooding, Idaho. They made their home in Pendleton. Joel was a long-haul truck driver, owning his own truck. He made many cross-country trips and retired in 1985. He received the American Trucking Association Safe Driver Award for having no accidents for 14 years. Joel had always been very handy. He enjoyed building, welding and fixing everything so it wouldn't ever break down again. He said the only thing he couldn't fix was himself. He was an engineer in everything but a degree. Joyce preceded him in death in August of 2006.

He is survived by his children: Thomas Jay Woodruff of Pendleton, OR, Alethea Love Hammer of Emmett, Idaho, and Mildred Hope Cellini of Suisun City, CA, sisters; Mary Ellen Fischer of Falls City, Oregon, Alice Marsh of Dove Creek, CO, and Ruth Maddy of Wahkiacus, WA, as well as three grandchildren, many nieces, nephews and friends.
